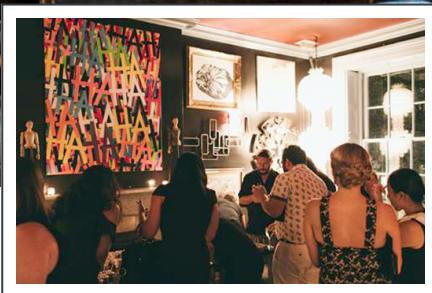

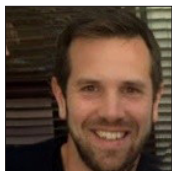
Big versus small in the age of tech disruption and innovation
